MEMORANDUM OF LAW

A default judgment may be opened when the moving party establishes three requirements: (1) a prompt filing of a petition to open the default judgment; (2) a meritorious defense; and (3) a reasonable excuse or explanation for its failure to file a responsive pleading. *Allegheny Hydro 1 v. Am. Line Bldrs.*, 722 A.2d 189, 191 (Pa.Super.1998) [754 A.2d 1282] (citing *Alba v. Urology Assocs. of Kingston*, 409 Pa.Super. 406, 598 A.2d 57, 58 (1991)). The standard of review for challenges to a decision concerning the opening of a default judgment is well-settled. In the case at bar, the Defendants have a meritorious defense based on the facts that will be proven in discovery.

Defendants ABC Capital were not served at its registered corporate headquarters' office. Finally, given this prompt filing, meritorious defense, need for discovery, and extremely reasonable excuse for a failure to respond to a pleading, the judgment should be opened and discovery should proceed.

WHEREFORE, Defendants respectfully request the Court to grant the Petition to Open Judgment and allow ABC Capital Investments, LLC to file an Answer and New Matter within 20 days in this matter.
